About our Pastor ~ Rev. Tom Bentley

Tom was ordained into the UCC in 1980 and has served many different UCC congregations in Massachusetts. Most of these calls were as a Designated Term Interim Pastor helping churches develop strategic planning to meet challenging changes. Up until 2020 Tom always pastored as a bi-vocational minister, maintaining a second career in human services, community organizing, and housing development. From 1986 Tom became the full-time founding Executive Director of Emmaus Inc. in Haverhill where he served 16 years. This non-profit is now the largest shelter provider in Essex County, assisting over 1,000 men, women, and children each year.

As an independent consultant since 1990 Tom also oversaw the funding and construction of hundreds of subsidized units, most of which targeted disadvantaged families and formerly homeless individuals. For decades he worked with non-profits throughout New England helping them develop services and housing for low-income groups. Tom likewise consulted for cities and towns to help them meet their goals for affordable housing. This often involved creating new homes for first-time homebuyers as well as renters.

In 2011 while pastoring Trinity Congregational Church in Gloucester, Tom organized and directed The Grace Center, a day services program for homeless and low-income adults. This agency now serves over 70 men and women each day.

In 2020 Tom reduced his housing consulting and human services work and concentrated his professional time exclusively to being a Designated Term Pastor at the First Church UCC in Rowley. He is excited to be beginning his new ministry as the Designated Term Pastor at Centre Congregational Church UCC in Lynnfield.

Tom lives in Gloucester with his wife Jeanne, who is a literacy specialist at Cathedral High School in Boston. They have three adult-age children. One year ago, Tom and Jeanne became grandparents to their first grandchild, Harrison.

Along with parish ministry and being a Grandad, Tom likes to direct his creative passions to oil painting, fiction writing, gourmet cooking, hiking, horticulture and most recently golf where his handicap is beyond calculation.

"Here's another story. Listen closely. There was once a man, a wealthy farmer, who planted a vineyard. He fenced it, dug a winepress, put up a watchtower, then turned it over to the farmhands and went off on a trip. When it was time to harvest the grapes, he sent his servants back to collect his profits. "The farmhands grabbed the first servant and beat him up. The next one they murdered. They threw stones at the third but he got away. The owner tried again, sending more servants. They got the same treatment. The owner was at the end of his rope. He decided to send his son. 'Surely,' he thought, 'they will respect my son.' "But when the farmhands saw the son arrive, they rubbed their hands in greed. 'This is the heir! Let's kill him and have it all for ourselves.' They grabbed him, threw him out, and killed him. "Now, when the owner of the vineyard arrives home from his trip, what do you think he will do to the farmhands?" "He'll kill them—a rotten bunch, and good riddance," they answered. "Then he'll assign the vineyard to farmhands who will hand over the profits when it's time."

Jesus said, "Right—and you can read it for yourselves in your Bibles:

The stone the masons threw out

is now the cornerstone.

This is God's work;

we rub our eyes, we can hardly believe it!

"This is the way it is with you. God's kingdom will be taken back from you and handed over to a people who will live out a kingdom life.

Whoever stumbles on this Stone gets shattered; whoever the Stone falls on gets smashed."

When the religious leaders heard this story, they knew it was aimed at them. They wanted to arrest Jesus and put him in jail, but, intimidated by public opinion, they held back. Most people held him to be a prophet of God.
