“Ma Duke & Friends” provides a Thanksgiving dinner for individuals who otherwise would

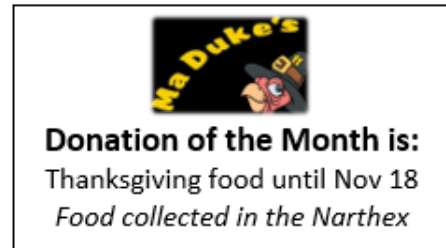
