Honoring Lent

We prepare for Christmas through Advent. Most of us prepare for Christmas through Christmas shopping, decorating, and parties. Our spiritual disciplines in Advent include Christmas pageants, attending church, and special opportunities to give.

A Christmas spiritual discipline practiced at Centre Church, "**Heifer Market**," is giving to Heifer International. Members of the parish make a financial contribution to purchase an animal or animals, receive a gift card which they then send to family and friends that explains that *"In your honor, a gift has been made to Heifer International providing livestock and training to struggling people around the world so they can become self-reliant for food and income. May this gift bring you joy as it brings hope to a family in need."* To read more visit: www.heifer.org. This type of gift-giving helps us avoid consumerism and honors giving for the sake of others instead of ourselves. This type of gift-giving is available to us all year round - for Christmas, birthdays, anniversaries, baptisms, Easter, Valentines, and anytime at Centre Church. Lent is another time of year when we may remember the way of Christ through spiritual disciplines. Prayer, Bible Study, attending church services, and sacrificial giving and self-denial, are often practiced spiritual disciplines in Lent, remembering the words of Jesus who spoke to his disciples:

"If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me will find it." (Matthew 16:24-25, NIV)

This year you may participate in Lenten disciplines at Centre Church in the following ways:

Attend Ash Wednesday Service

Wednesday, February 17th, 7:30 pm in our Chapel. This service recalls the meaning of our baptism through confession, baptism renewal, and the imposition of ashes. Everyone is invited.

Participate in our Lenten Bible Study,

"Living Rooms through Lent," led by Rev. Bailey and Kathi Martin of Education Ministries. This Bible Study will, over five weeks, study the scriptures about the events of Holy Week. We have planned two groups at the church:

Self Denial Offering

Another valuable Lenten Discipline is a sacrificial offering. My childhood church and again, my first parish, used Self-Denial offering folders as a practical and meaningful way of walking with Jesus through Lent and Holy Week.

I have ordered, at my own expense, 100 Self-Denial folders. They will be available in the office and on a table in the Narthex during Lent. During each of the 40 days in Lent (excluding Sundays) you can place \$1.00 in the folder (totaling \$40.00 per envelope) returning it by Easter Sunday.

Given that we are over \$12,000 behind in our pledged income and that our Repair and Maintenance Budget is already over \$7,000 over extended for the year, we need everyone to consider giving some extra.

This has been an important ministry of Centre Church for almost 25 years. Each month, on the first Wednesday of the month, a faithful crew gathers in our church kitchen to prepare a meal for the hungry. It takes an average of \$325.00 to purchase the supplies for this meal that feeds

between 125-150 people. You may contribute to help us secure this continuing commitment, through checks to "Centre Church," memo: Bread and Roses.

Everyone can participate in some form of Lenten spiritual discipline to help remember the suffering servant, Jesus, as he journeyed to the cross for us. Of course, I believe it starts by our joining together in worship through prayer, music, study of the scriptures, and by the nurturing of our ties in fellowship.

And, quoting from her email, "soup, soup, soup...we mix and match to give everyone something warm before bed."

There will be a box in the narthex with hearts on it where you may place donations. If each person just brought in a couple of items, think what an impact it would make at the shelter. If you are not able to get out, you may mail a donation payable to the church and I will buy socks, etc. Please make sure to note on the memo line Lynn Shelter.
