Crying Out to the LORD

(Please read Psalm 28)

How often do you cry out to the Lord? How often do you cry out to the LORD for mercy, for help? How often have things been so bad in your life that you lift your hands up to God and cry out for help?

I was in Junior College in the fall of 1966. I was confused and afraid. I had little or no self-confidence. I had family and friends who believed in me more than I believed in myself. And yet, as I think of it now, I had a lot more strength than it seemed at the time.

I had the strength of my faith, born of a rural, hardworking, persistent community of people dependent on the land. Such faith is not one easily given to conceding to defeat. In fact, the faith born of such places is known for its ability to bring people together to help each other against the most challenging of circumstances.

We knew how to cry out to the Lord, for rain, for the harvest, for the well-being of our family and friends who were sick, who were getting married, giving birth to children, trying to find work.

In Psalm 28 reference is made to "your Most Holy Place." Our "Most Holy Place" was considered to be the sanctuary of our church where we gathered every Sunday, even when it was a good day to harvest the wheat or bale the hay. We believed that when we honored the Lord, Our God, who had given us all that we had, God would bless us, no matter how hard things may have seemed at the time. We had faith that the Lord would see us through.

Sometimes, as a child, it seemed silly to me that we were so very faithful in setting aside

everything in order to attend worship every Sunday. I would see other people doing other things on Sundays that I would like to do, instead of going to church. I would think about how lucky they are to be able to do such, although I did not want to be bringing in the crops on a Sunday morning.

I know now, though, that because of my parents' persistence in faith and worship, they gave me something that was stronger than what a lot of my peers had and have, a faith in God and the Lord, Jesus, that has the ability to prevail against all evil, sin, and bad luck.

What is especially important, I believe, is that the more we honor the Lord with our presence, the more capable we become as servants of the Lord to be of assistance to others who cry out to the Lord, or who need help crying out, offering prayers,

and finding the strength to see things through. The more experience we have following Jesus, putting ourselves at risk on his behalf, the more capable we can become as leaders of others, and the more we are able to give of ourselves for the sake of others.

What a joy, what a reward to be able to be of support to others in their time of need, of congregations and communities when leadership is needed and to know that we have this gift because we were taught to cry out to the Lord for help, and found the Lord to be responsive.

I invite you to find "your Most Holy Place," and talk with God about what plans he has for you, to comfort, to lead, to allow you the honor of helping him build a better world, in your house, church, community, and in our world.

The LORD will not turn a deaf ear to you.
