Advent

Are you struggling with patience? Are you struggling to have hope?

As a child I remember how hard it was to be patient and wait for the things I wanted, for Christmas to arrive. I knew, though, that my parents were always doing the best they could for my brother and me. The world also seemed a lot bigger then, living, as we did, many miles from stores and shopping centers. Shopping malls didn't exist when I was a child. A trip to a shopping center was at least 45 minutes away and given how busy we were on our family farm, those trips didn't take place very often.

As I have grown, the things I want are a lot more because everything is so much more available. I usually don't have to be patient for the things I want because I can either go to a mall or shopping center within 15 minutes from where I live and/or go online and have something delivered to my front door either the next day or within 3 days, max.

Like a lot of us, a trip to the grocery store is usually when I'm going from one thing to another and I want it to be quick. So, when the lines are long and I have to wait to cash out for more than 3 minutes, I am tempted to be very impatient. As I feel impatience welling up inside me, I ask God to hear my prayer (I know, it's corny, but it works for me.)

*Jesus Lord,
make me aware
to be patient,
do I dare?*

*Make me aware
of the presence of others
Time and space to share.*

*As I expect others to be courteous
May a courteous nature I also share.*

*Jesus was born for all,
Clerks and sales persons, also, for them he cares.*

So let me be patient.

My turn will come.

*Jesus will get around to me,
As sure as the shining of the sun.*

You see, I need to remind myself that I am no more important in the heart of God than anyone else. In fact, perhaps I'm even less important because Jesus gave a lot of importance to the people he called "the least of these," who shall enter the Kingdom of heaven first.

Advent is a time for me to consider what is important. It is important to patiently wait my turn. It is important to treat the person for whom I am waiting with respect, love, and courtesy because that person is often overwhelmed with the concerns of others. It is important to remember that all of God's children are important, and given that I am warm, well-fed, loved by many others, and capable of taking care of myself, I can wait, patiently wait my turn for there are many, many others who need to be taken care of before me.
