Have you ever received an award, won a competition, received recognition for something? I remember how excited I was when I received my acceptance letter to college. That felt like a great award. And, after a sometimes very difficult 5 vears, I remember how amazed I was to be graduated from college, going on to graduate school.

When I think about my life thus far, the places where I have felt special recognition have been at my graduations, and when I have been offered the opportunities to be a pastor. I don't remember where I was when I was offered my first position as pastor, but I do remember how excited and honored I was to be called as pastor of Central Congregational Church, Jamaica Plain, MA. Oh, the honor it was to be the pastor of the people there, and to be given the opportunity to be involved in the community, serving on the Board of Directors of a social service agency where I met so many people who gave of themselves so generously to make life better for so many others.

My second call to be pastor came in the summer of 1989, when I was attending the General Synod of the United Church of Christ in Dallas, Texas. The secretary of the Search Committee of First Congregational Church in Billerica, MA, called me and told me that they wanted me to be their candidate. They had actually offered me the position three days earlier, but I had to tell them that I was having brain surgery to remove a benign tumor, an acoustic neuroma, August 23, 1989. After prayerful consideration, they decided I was still their candidate and in early October, 1989, I candidated and was voted their pastor! What an honor, what an award!

And my third call came while I was driving one day. Debbie Cotting called me, and knowing that this could be an important call, I stopped my car along the side of the road before continuing the conversation. She told me that the Search Committee had voted to ask me to be their candidate for the position of Pastor of Centre Congregational Again, they voted this despite some Church. challenging personal circumstances that I was going through at the time. And, when Debbie told me, that day, I danced along the side of the road, so excited. Again, what an honor! What an award!

One of my greatest "awards" is to continue to serve as your pastor because you are a congregation that successfully serves the work of God here and in the world. I have the privilege to work with wonderful colleagues in ministry who are

the pastors of other churches in Lynnfield, Wakefield, and Peabody. I have the privilege to serve as Chaplain of the Lynnfield Fire Department, getting to know those who are ready to risk their lives for the sake of others.

What a surprise it was to walk into Teresa's Italian Eatery Restaurant, Middleton, MA, on Wednesday, July 18th, to find at least 30 members of Centre Church at the Lynnfield Rotary Club's annual dinner, where I was to be inducted as a new member! Well, obviously, there was more to it than that. The invitation had been secretly sent out for the occasion of the Rotary Club's presentation of their Citizen of the Year award. I had no clue! You can keep a good secret.

I am so honored to be considered for this honor by the Rotary Club but even more honored that so many from Centre Church attended! The award was given for my work in organizing Lynnfield's remembrance of the tenth anniversary of the terrorist attacks on the United States on September 11, 2001.

Therefore, I dedicate this award to the memory of all who died on 911, and especially to all of the first responders who died in an effort to save the lives of others.

I am grateful for the love and support of all at Centre Church who helped with all that we did in the town of Lynnfield for the 911 remembrances, including Douglas Hodgkins and the ecumenical choir. I also appreciate the efforts of so many in the town, the Rotary Club, the Lynnfield Fire Department, the Department of Public Works, the Lynnfield Police Department, and so many citizens and persons who contributed financial and personal involvement support.

Like all meaningful things that we accomplish in life, we never do it alone. I appreciate everyone who came to the many meetings, who contributed so many wonderful ideas, the hundreds of volunteers to read names, those who sang, those who built a platform, those colleagues who supported and participated, the support of our elected officials in Lynnfield and at the state level, and so many others.

There are awards that we are given that we do not strive for. This is one such award for me. I did this for the sake of those who died, for the sake of those who live with the lose of loved ones, for the sake of the first responders who died and for the sake of the first responders who continue to serve knowing that at any moment they may have to put their lives in harms way in order to save others.

My award is to see others find their place of service to Jesus Christ in the world and, in that, find fulfillment and reward.

Let us continue to give ourselves to this great purpose, serving the Lord our God without thought of award and/or reward, but for the sake of anyone, anywhere to whom we can be a blessing sharing the gospel, being the gospel, building houses, sharing life (through Heifer International, in particular), and sharing the good fortune, education, opportunity, and countless resources that have been given to us.

I congratulate Fr. Jack Farrell on his retirement as Pastor and Priest from Our Lady of Assumption Parish, Lynnfield. I shall miss him so much, as a colleague and friend. I ask God's blessing upon him, and upon the Our Lady of Assumption Parish. It has been a great honor for me to know him and work with him. He is one of a kind!!!
