Will 2013 Be A Year of the Lord's Favor?

Let's go to where I always start for such important questions, Scripture. The Prophet Isaiah, tells us what makes for "The Year of the Lord's Favor."

The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, and provide for those who grieve in Zion—to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. (Isaiah 61)

 $2012\ did$ not end like a year lived in the Lord's favor...

...with the murders of 20 elementary school children and 6 staff at the Sandy Hook Elementary School, Newtown, CT in December, along with the murder of Nancy Lanza, at the hands of Adam Lanza, age 20;

...with the murders of two volunteer Firefighters in Webster, NY on Christmas Eve morning, Tomasz Kaczówka and Webster Police Lieutenant Mike Chiapperini, while two other volunteer firefighters were seriously injured by the same alleged gunman sniper, William Spengler who apparently planned the ambush by setting houses on fire to lure the first responders to the scene:

...and, also on Christmas Eve morning, in West Houston, Texas, with the murders of a Bellaire Police officer, Cpl. Jimmie Norman and a local business man bystander when gunfire erupted after a police chase.

2012 did not end like a year in the Lord's favor with our elected officials leading us over the Fiscal Cliff because they are defending the "rights" of the wealthy instead of needs of the poor. They did not run out of time! They had plenty of time to resolve this long before December ever began, and yet, they further threatened the

financial well-being of their citizenry, increasing the anxiety of all of us, and contributing to further instability in our financial markets.

Of course, this is not what God intended for us when his prophet, Isaiah, spoke of a Year of the Lord's Favor.

I would like us to pray for 2013, that it will be a Year of the Lord's Favor, a year when we are willing to spend more time speaking on behalf of the safety of our children and teachers than we are defending the rights of gun owners to own as many guns as they want. I was appalled at the NRA's response saying that more guns are the solution to protecting our children. I was appalled that they needed time to formulate a response and that when they did respond, it was more guns in our schools to protect the innocent.

Jesus had an answer for this: "Put your sword back in its place," Jesus said to him, "for all who draw the sword will die by the sword". (Matthew 26:52, NIV). The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King said as much.

Sermon by the Rev. Dr. Dennis C. Bailey Child Care for children up to age 5 at 9:00 a.m. Older children in church "Violence begets violence." My response: More guns beget more violence, more murder, more death. How can the United States of America be free with all of these guns, assault type guns in particular, so available to our citizens? How can our children and our teachers feel safe, secure, and free?

If we are to make 2013 A Year of the Lord's Favor we must as citizens, as elected officials, as people of faith have the courage to do more than argue about the "right to bear arms." First, we must have some common sense. The right to bear arms was never intended to put assault weapons, or any weapon, into the hands of those who could so easily take innocent lives, be they children or adults.

I remember the rage we all felt as a result of the terrorist acts of September 11, 2001, wanting to do whatever it took to make sure such a thing never happened again. I am not feeling that, as a nation, we are displaying the same rage, willing to do whatever it takes to make sure such a thing never happens again, in an elementary school, in a movie theatre, on a college campus, or in any place of gathering. On this occasion, these murders are not the fault of another nation, or terrorist of another country. On this occasion, they are the fault of our own people.

In 1970 Walt Kelly first used the quote "We Have Met The Enemy and He Is Us" on a poster for Earth Day in 1970. I feel that it most certainly applies now to us as a nation.

Will we live, act, pray, and choose to make 2013 a Year of the Lord's Favor where the brokenhearted will be given front stage to our desires to do the right thing, or will we continue to give way to the acts and weapons of violence? Will we give front stage to the wealthy, or consider first those who mourn, those who cannot speak for themselves, like the mentally challenged?

Let's turn our weapons into instruments for education: computers, schools, desks, and programs for those who need our unconditional love and attention. Then, we will, with Francis of Assisi, become instruments of peace. Then, we will fulfill our Lord's call to let the children safely come, for to such as these belongs the Kingdom of Heaven.
