Sweeping Floors

What is it about sweeping a floor that brings my attention to God?

Dirt. Dirt, yes, dirt. I make dirt that falls on my floor and I have to clean it up. No one else is going to do it for me. I have to look down and see the facts; that I have made a mess that has fallen on my floor. "Where did all of this dirt come from?" I ask myself. Well, from me. Yes, just me. I cannot point my finger at anyone else. I don't know about you, but, I don't like knowing that I make a mess.

Spiritually, I don't like knowing that I hurt another person's feelings or that I let another person down. It is what we talk about when we talk about sin; hurting, harming, disobeying God, breaking promises that we have made, insulting another, stealing, lying, killing, breaking a relationship, like marriage, speaking of God and/or another person disrespectfully.

So, sweeping my floors helps me understand that I need to ask God for forgiveness and, when I hurt others, ask them for forgiveness, also. It helps knowing that we all make dirt, and that we all sin. I am no different from anyone else. Just look at your floors.

When others clean up after us, we can grow accustomed to not paying attention to the dirt we create, the dishes we leave, and the way we leave rooms where we meet, work, and live. We can also grow accustomed to not paying attention to the people who do the work of

cleaning up after us. So, when I use a space I try to think about it before I leave, wondering if I need to clean up after myself, out of respect for the space, for those who may be using it next, but also out of respect for the person who cleans up after me so as not take advantage of that person.

Now, we have this space, this earth upon which we live. Who is going to clean up after

The way we leave it and care for it directly affects others, those present and those yet to be born. We make a mess, we should clean it up. It is important that we think about that from time to time and give consideration to how we affect the care of our earth by the way we live. Some of us consider recycling a nuisance and unnecessary expense, but, I know that it is responsible stewardship of our earth and that recycling pays dividends in cost savings. There is one trash collection company in New Hampshire, H20 Waste Disposal, that doesn't charge to recycle because they sell their recyclables, saving the consumer money and being responsible stewards. We all make trash and it needs to be cleaned up responsibly.

As we approach Ash Wednesday and Lent, let us take time to think about our "dirt." What is it in our lives that needs to be cleaned up? Our stewardship of our earth, the way we care for the people God has given to us, our family and friends? Is there someone we need to call and/or need to visit that we have neglected and promised to stay in touch. I know that it hurts when friends make promises to us and then fail to keep them. Perhaps this is a good time for us to reconnect, ask for forgiveness, and start anew.

We can also think about our relationship with God. Have we grown distant from God? Have we neglected to give thanks to God, to spend time in worship, to fulfill the promises we have made to God? When we fall away from the relationships that have nourished us, given us life and hope, we leave a mess, dirt. Let's try to clean it up in this upcoming season of Lent. No one will do it for us, but, the Lord, our God, and perhaps some of our friends, will help us, and forgive us.
