People I've Met Who Confirm My Faith: In Fargo, ND

People that I have met continue to influence me, even years later. Scripture shows how this is also true in the faith that we have inherited.

The Prophet Isaiah spoke about how a new way of living needed to come to pass if Israel was to be reborn as per God's will:

Isaiah 61:1-2 (NIV)

1 The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted. to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, 2 to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn.

Jesus, early in his ministry, references Isaiah's very words as a way of reminding those of his time, and I believe, us, that this remains his primary mission and message if we are to be true to God's will for us, his people:

Luke 4:18-19 (NIV)

18 "The Spirit of the Lord is on me. He has anointed me to tell the good news to poor people. He has sent me to announce freedom for prisoners. He has sent me so that the blind will see again. He wants me to free those who are beaten down. And he has sent me to announce the year when he will set his people free."

July 5, 1997:

I was just over 2,000 miles on my 4,600 mile bicycle trip from West Coast to East. I had been invited to spend two nights at the Fargo, ND Fire Department Station Headquarters by Assistant Chief Joe Upton, member and President of the First Congregational Church, U.C.C., Fargo, North Dakota. My bicycle desperately needed two new tires, tubes, and brakes.

I learned from the Firefighters that there was a bicycle shop 2 ½ blocks away, around the corner from the Fire Station. I called. Phil Stone answered. I explained what I needed. He said they could help me. "Do you need directions?" he asked. I said, "No. I'm staying at the Fire Department around the corner. I'll be right over." Once at the bicycle shop I met Phil.

He assured me that he could do all that I needed, that it would be ready in a couple of hours.

Then, Phil asked, "How did you come to stay at the Fire Department?" I went on to explain that I was a United Church of Christ (Congregational) minister, that I had contacted local churches asking for help finding places to stay on my cross country bicycle trip. The pastor of First Congregational Church in Fargo had put me in touch with Assistant Chief Upton, and he did the rest.

Phil was beaming with a big smile as I talked and finally, when I let him get a word in, he shared, "My father is Rev. Nelson Stone, former pastor at First Congregational Church, Fargo, and my father was the Chaplain of the Fargo Fire Department, and I spent most of my childhood hanging out at the Fire Department."

What a coincidence! Of all the people in Fargo to work on my bicycle! Phil and I agreed, someone besides human beings had a hand in this. I had been in Fargo just an hour and I had already heard from the firefighters about how Rev. Nelson Stone had been chaplain to the department and that he was a great guy. His picture was still posted beside all the firefighters. Now, in just over an hour, I had also met Rev. Stone's son, still living and working in Fargo. Rev. Stone's son was going to "bless" my bicycle and my trip, by servicing it!!!

You know, I felt as if the hand of the Lord was upon me! I was greeted in Fargo, ND with great and grand hospitality by the Firefighters, by Phil Stone at the bike shop, and then, again on Sunday morning, the day after I arrived, in worship and fellowship at the First Congregational Church.

Assistant Chief Upton picked me up after worship that Sunday and gave me his own personal grand tour of Fargo and then took me to the airport to witness the July 6th Air Show which included the Navy's Blue Angels.

The Firefighters welcomed me to their table for meals and conversation. I was a stranger, and they welcomed me, carrying on the grand spiritual tradition of hospitality that Jesus taught us to model to everyone we meet. I have never forgotten my spiritual friends in Fargo. God was, and I pray, remains present there.

Thanks be to God who goes ahead of us to prepare the way. I pray that I can continue to stay on the path that God has prepared so that I continue to meet God's special disciples.
