#### June 11, 2014

Dear Friends,

As I write this, the day of Pentecost has just passed; the Christian calendar holds just a short "after Pentecost" time before we enter into the season called "Ordinary Time."

What's point of writing about the liturgical year? Most of us never think about it except perhaps for Advent to Christmas and Lent to Easter. It doesn't seem to connect with our daily living.

A couple of gifts come from it, though. One: it tells the story of God's loving power and powerful love through the gift and presence of Jesus, the mystery of the Resurrection, the hope given in the gift of the Holy Spirit, and then what it means to be the church in the world. And two: we get a reminder every year that Ordinary Time doesn't have to be ordinary.

When I first shared in worship with this congregation on June 1, I offered a little preface to the wonderful Pentecost service that Barbara, Doug, volunteers, and students created for us the following Sunday. I mentioned the fruits of a life lived open to God's Holy Spirit and encouraged us all to examine both where those fruits are already evident in our lives and where we might pray for the ones we'd like to show forth day-to-day.

The fruits of the Holy Spirit are: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. They are not gold stars to be achieved; they are GIFTS. They shine forth in a life open to God's Spirit for guidance, learning, comfort, strength, challenge, and courage.

Do you know someone who is willing to accept others, to act on behalf of another even when he or she doesn't "feel" like doing so? There's love. How about someone who has real hardships and losses but seems to meet them realistically yet

without rancor or bitterness? There's joy. The person who may be able to do something very easily but who waits over and over while a child, friend, or coworker has to try again and again? Patience. You get the idea.

These are gifts that are "lived into." When you pray for the Holy Spirit to guide your days, and you remember each day that you have done so (no autopilot here!), you can discover yourself having opportunities to live them out. You always have the choice to say "no!" – the Spirit does not coerce, only invites and empowers – but if you are like me, often when you said "no" to the moment, later you will find that you could have done something helpful (or refrained from doing something hurtful).

Ordinary Time doesn't have to be ordinary. It can be a real adventure in faith, leading to an increasingly fruitful harvest. Try it out this summer.

She is excited at the prospect of working with our experienced staff, our supportive parents, and the children of Tower Day to ensure that Tower Day School continues to offer excellent programs to our pre-school and kindergarten students in a safe and nurturing environment. Over the coming weeks, Leah will meet with Sally in order to make a smooth transition.

We feel that Leah has all the qualities we were looking for in our new director. Leah brings not only her education, knowledge, and experience, but also a friendly personality and sense of humor-important qualities in any preschool and kindergarten setting. We are thrilled that Leah is joining the Tower Day Team.
