# April 29, 2015

#### "BY FAITH" Monday, April 20, 2015 The 119<sup>th</sup> Running of the Boston Marathon

It was the biggest field of runners ever, they said on TV as I watched from the comfort of the living room. The conditions were less than ideal, given the forecast included rain, although temperatures at the start of the race were good for running, cool, not hot. The rain had started at 8 am, and there was wind.

This was the 33<sup>rd</sup> running of the Boston Marathon for Team Hoyt. Father, Dick was not running in this year's marathon, now at age 74, but son, Rick was in the race, pushed by runner Bryon Lyons from Methuen with, as he said, "a fresher pair of legs." Father Dick and son, Rick will continue to run in shorter races.

In honor of father, Dick Hoyt, he was named the Grand Marshall of this year's Marathon. Together, Dick and Rick Hoyt completed over 1,000 races, including marathons, duathlons and triathlons (6 of them being Ironman competitions). Also adding to their list of achievements, Dick and Rick biked and ran across the U.S. in 1992, completing a full 3,735 miles in 45 days.

This is an amazing team! I cannot begin to comprehend what this remarkable father and son team have accomplished. Massachusetts should name a whole year after them, "*Massachusetts The Year of Team Hoyt*," giving them free tolls across the state, free admission to every attraction and event across the state, public and private, finding restaurants where they can eat free, making them an honorary State Representative for the year, even Mayor for a Day at our local cities and towns, keys to the cities and towns, and all that!

*"Yes You Can,"* their theme and mission, is about educating people about how those living with disabilities can become active members of our communities.

I know firsthand what it takes to run a marathon. I ran three Boston Marathons (1998, 1999, and 2000) and I know how hard it can be, but, the hardest part is the training required to get ready. **On the other hand, I know nothing**  of what Dick and Rick Hoyt have accomplished except as a mere spectator and admirer. How have they done it???

#### *"For we live by faith, not by sight."* (2 Corinthians 5:7)

The eleventh chapter of Hebrews is a great testimony about those who have been ordinary people who have lived not by sight, but by faith. As a result, like Dick and Rick Hoyt, they have accomplished what others said was impossible.

Abraham and Sarah, for example, never dreamed that they would leave their homeland, venture out, under God's direction, to an unknown place to start a new people, to give birth while in advanced age, beyond normal childbearing years. But, by faith, not by sight, they did.

God even called upon Rahab, a prostitute, to welcome the spies, to help them fulfill God's plans. By faith, she obeyed and was not killed.

Scripture reports so many others: "...Gideon, Barak, Samson and Jephthah, David and Samuel and the prophets, who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, and gained what was promised; who shut the mouths of lions, quenched

Women received back their dead, raised to life again. There were others who were tortured, refusing to be released so that they might gain an even better resurrection." (Hebrews 11:32-25, NIV)

What shall we do by faith, and not by sight? Do we pray, believing that God is listening and will respond? Do we plant a seed believing that it will die and give birth to new life, a vegetable, a flower, a tree? By faith, not by sight, yes, we do.

I have experienced firsthand how living by faith, not by sight, can work. I have believed that the Holy Spirit is working in our church communities and congregations. I do not know how, but occasionally I see it.

A family member dies and others in the family decide that it is time for them, in gratitude for the church's ministry, to return and contribute, taking on positions of leadership, contributing financially, and living by faith.

A woman who has experienced divorce, and gone from one vocational experience to another, never satisfied or fulfilled, discovers God's calling into ministry. She continues to serve and find reward beyond all expectations, living by faith, not by sight! And further, she remarried a man who was a life-long Roman Catholic, who never dreamed he would be married to a protestant minister. He, too, has learned to live by faith, not by sight. His now late mother, also a life-long Roman Catholic, even shared a message at her daughter-in-law's ordination about faith.

Life has so much to offer. But life as a disciple of Jesus Christ, living by faith in what God desires for us, has so much more to offer, so much more. As we continue to celebrate Easter we prepare for Pentecost, May 24<sup>th</sup>, when the Spirit of God is released, engaging and setting afire all willing souls who wish to live by faith.

Are the doors of your heart, mind, body and soul open to welcoming the Spirit's desires and gifts? Are you willing to live by faith, and not by sight? I pray that you are open and welcoming to that spirit every day and even as you sleep. Perhaps a sleepless night, a dream, a chance encounter, something out of the ordinary in the course of a normal day, will bring you to an awareness that God has something more for you.
