Seasons of Spring

I was thinking about the season of spring in which we find ourselves when I came across this text:

Faithfulness springs forth from the earth, and righteousness looks down from heaven.

(Psalm 85:11, NIV)

Given the challenging nature of this past winter, I am especially grateful for spring this year. Life springs forth from God's creation so generously given to us here, in New England. There are also signs of God's continuing gift of life in the form of graduations and celebrations; celebrations of mothers who have given us life, children and grandchildren full of life. People are out jogging, bike riding, pushing their children around places, taking them to the park, golfing, mowing yards, planting flowers, bushes, and trees, and making yards new again.

Yes, it was hard to see it and, sometimes, believe it this past winter. I still have a picture of the banks of snow as high as my van in my driveway.

And yet, there are those among us who are presently going through "winter" in their lives. Our sisters and brothers in Nepal, for example, have literally had their world tumble down upon them, taking thousands of lives, homes, temples, businesses, and causing countless injury. Our brothers and sisters in at least 5 states have and are experiencing losses of life, homes, businesses, also, via the tornadoes, rain, and storms. And, the civil unrest in Baltimore, Maryland, as the result of the death of Freddie Gray, has reigned "winter" upon a city that has been struggling to find a "spring" for some time now.

And, I am aware of some folks who are personally going through their own "winter" challenge, via illness, grief, and anxiety.

Where do we find comfort, hope, and healing in the midst of these "winters?"

> From Scriptures, where the Psalmist reminds us: "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear,

though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging. The LORD Almighty is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress."

From our love and care of each other:

From The Moderator

I'd like to give you an update on our 2015 finances and what we should expect as we prepare to close our fiscal year on June 30.

As you may remember, the congregation approved a final operating budget that left us with a deficit exceeding \$66,000.00. Parish Council asked the Stewardship Team to once again hold a supplemental pledge drive to balance the budget and also increase the capital maintenance reserve so the building exterior could be painted. To date we have raised \$33,780 toward this effort. We are very grateful to everyone who has contributed, yet we still find ourselves short of our goal.

Also included in the 2015 budget was projected income that the church would receive from the Verizon Wireless agreement that was signed last fall. We had assumed that we would begin receiving payment from Verizon Wireless in January of this year. We based this on conversation with Verizon Wireless and their eagerness to get this agreement finalized. Unfortunately, due to other business requirements, Verizon Wireless have not begun any installation construction which is the driving component related to when their payments begin. Though we are confident that this agreement will eventually produce income for Centre Church, we do not expect any payments (\$12,000.00) to be realized in fiscal year 2015.

In January the flakes began to fall and two months later we had endured the snowiest winter on record. As you would expect, we exceeded the plowing and sanding budget which has increased our projected expenses.

With all these events considered and if everything remained static for the remainder of the year, we will have a closing operating deficit of almost \$54,000.00 with nothing added to the painting fund. This is not what we had hoped for, therefore with less than 2 months remaining in this fiscal year, Parish Council asks all parishioners be sure your yearly pledge is on track and up to date. Also, please consider a donation to the supplemental pledge drive, as it would be much appreciated.
