placed within and encouraged people of all ages to see, also.

Yesterday I witnessed it in the children's singing of the "Arky, Arky" and "Heavenly Aeroplane" songs and participation in Children's Sunday. I witnessed it in the celebration of Heifer International's Ministry. I witnessed it in the singing of the Doxology by 4 ½ year old Cameron DiGiorgio as he sang it for us without accompaniment. I witnessed in the singing of The Blessing by Jill DiGiorgio and Lauren Donadio while Elizabeth Miller and Rachelle Votano danced to the song. I witnessed it in the testimonies of other Christian Educators who came to celebrate the many ways that Barbara's ministry has blessed and encouraged others who have successfully trained and become Certified Christian Educators.

Most especially, I witnessed it in the testimonies of our college graduates who powerfully testified how the to ministries of Barbara Langill, Jill Couillard, and Jeff Langill called forth from them the gifts of service that
