One of my favorite places to vacation is along the ocean waters in Maine. This has also been the case this summer. My friend, Linda and I spend a lot of time in Wells, ME. We also spent a couple of days on Mount Desert Island, Maine, in Acadia National Park and in Bar Harbor where we witnessed a beautiful sunrise on August 18<sup>th</sup>.



We often check the tide table in the morning to determine our plans for the day. At low tide, there is always plenty of beach to walk and to sit and enjoy, even when there are large crowds. At high tide beach going is apt to be a lot more crowded but with a little luck, you can still find a place to park and sit on the beach. We are amused at how some people draw a circle in the sand around their spot as if to tell the ocean tide, "you cannot encroach upon this area of the beach where I am sitting." In reality, we cannot stop the tides from rising and falling twice a day. As I think of the ocean tides I also think about the changing tides in our lives. Like high tide, we have times when our lives are full and exciting. Like low tide, we have times when we seem to be stuck, like a boat on a sand bar, unable to go anywhere.

Like the tides are always changing, so are things in our lives. Even when we think things will not change, they are and will. We must be patient and wait. God made the oceans, through the power of the moon's gravity, to be constantly changing, constantly rising and falling.

These changes have purpose in our lives. As the tides change they bring us new things, but, they also take things away. I see how people rake the seaweed at the beach and take it down to water's edge at low tide in the hopes that high tide will take it away. This usually works. But sometimes the tides take things away that we love. The forces of life, like the forces of the tides, are powerful. There are some things that we cannot change.

Even when the waters are calm and it seems as if there is no movement, the invisible movements of the oceans are ebbing and flowing. It is just the same with God who is always present and always at work in our lives. God loves us and has created this most amazing world in which we live as a great and beautiful blessing to us. Without the moon's gravity at play, the ocean could not rise and fall, cleanse itself, and give off oxygen.

Let us remember, that even if the tides do not seem to be in our favor, God is always at work in our lives to bring us new life. Sometimes the new life cannot come until other things have been removed. Just as God has created our world to serve us, God's love endures forever. May we serve that love by loving and protecting the world God has given us for the sake of generations yet to come.

I share with you one more picture, of sunrise at Bar Harbor, symbolic of the new day, of the new opportunities, of the new life that God gives to us. May we receive it and be grateful!
