Dear friends,

Over the last couple of Saturdays, I visited two elders with whom I am very close. My Aunt Clara is 94 and lives in Maine and my friend Gilda is 92 and lives in Quincy. They're interesting and I always come away having learned something. I love spending time with them.

Aunt Clara is energetic and still puts on a suit and high heels to go out. She lives in her own home, but she doesn't hear very well, nor does she drive. In 8 months, Aunt Clara lost her entire social circle comprised of her sister, her sister-in-law, and her best friend. Her friend June used to drive everywhere, including to church and to a weekly card game. These days Aunt Clara just stays home. I went to Maine to take her to lunch. Four and a half hours later, we'd had lunch, gone to the bank, been to the dollar store, and done a month's worth of grocery shopping. My heart broke a little.

Gilda's circumstances also tug at my heart. At 92, she still lives in her own home and cooks robust Italian meals every day, but she freezes much of what she makes because she doesn't have a lot of company. Gilda has macular degeneration and no longer drives. She wanted the 88 cent per pound chicken, so I brought her to Stop and Shop. I was alternately horrified and moved to tears at our adventure. First, she almost ran her cart into a child's head. The child was in one of those special carriages with a car in front and he was leaning out. Gilda didn't notice and got way too close for my comfort. She also needed help shopping because she couldn't tell what was chicken or what was beef; and she certainly couldn't read prices or sell-by dates. Do you know Aunt Clara or Gilda by other names? Do you see a little bit of yourself in these women? Some will ask--where are their families? They could be out of state or maybe they're sandwiched between caring for their parents and a spouse. They could be caring for their children or grandchildren.

*I don't know where their families are, but I know where I am. I know what I can do.* As an extroverted people-person, I enjoy visiting very much. Here at Centre Church, I visit with people every week. I also spend a good amount of time on the phone. Additionally, I send cards frequently and also sermons to some who are unable to get to church. On May 4<sup>th</sup>, I'll be hosting "Lunch with the Pastor" at the Senior Center.

## Church populations are aging and the average age of a person in a UCC church is 65. What does this mean for us at Centre Church--now and in the future?

Take a peek at the People Book and you may be surprised to notice how many people who once served this church so faithfully are no longer able to come to worship. As much as I love visiting, I'm afraid that one person alone can't get to visit everyone often enough while still preaching, teaching, responding to pastoral care needs, actively discerning and developing new ministry opportunities, working with existing ministry teams and ecumenical clergy, as well as promoting the church.

**Will you help?** The two biggest needs I've observed are **the need for** <u>visits</u> and the need for <u>rides</u> to worship and church events. We do have a couple of

people who are providing rides to those who cannot drive and I am *very grateful*, but the needs outweigh our current ability. I've also noticed that there are times when a meal would be most welcome, such as when someone is ill, has had a loss and even when someone has had a baby.

**Can you commit to making one meal a season, one visit a month, or ride a week?** I guarantee that when you give, you will get back much, much more than you give. When we care for one another, we are cared for in return! Perhaps we can start a Care Team. A Care Team could be a great ministry to serve across all of our generations.
