## Prepare

The Advent Season is one of expectant anticipation as we wait for Christmas and the birth of Jesus, our Savior. We're told that in Biblical times, Jewish people were oppressed and marginalized. The Hebrew Bible (Old Testament) foretold a savior who would emancipate and redeem them.

It's not a surprise that in our culture of 'on-demand' downloads and 'one-click' online shopping, many of us eschew waiting. When things are going well, waiting isn't a big deal. Yes, we count down the days to our vacations, but we fill the time with distractions such as buying new luggage and sunscreen. When you're scared, or lonely, or hurting; waiting can seem interminable. Just think back to a time when your child was injured and you waited to see the doctor...or for the results...or for the healing to take place. I've just described times of uncertainty. During these times of waiting, we pray and we lean upon our faith for strength and direction.

For us to truly understand the Advent Season, we must put ourselves in that place of uncertainty and prayerful expectation. Over the next four weeks, we'll be lighting candles of peace, hope, joy and love. The candles signify that Christ will bring his light and these gifts into the world.

The real spirit of Christmas doesn't lie in the presents or the parties. It lies in the hope we read about in the gospel. "The angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord". (Luke2:10-11)

In this holiday season, let us prepare ourselves to again feel a renewed sense of hope. Jesus saves us, but not by waving a magic wand. He saves us by letting us know that we are accepted, forgiven and loved. Let us wait expectantly upon the Christ who lives, cares, and is steadfastly alongside. Jesus doesn't save us by changing things. He saves us by changing us.

## Sunday Morning with the Children

**Nursery:** Our Church Nursery is fully staffed and ready to receive infants and children up to age 3 on Sunday mornings during worship. Pagers are available to ensure Nursery Caregivers can easily communicate with parents.

### Faith Formation

**Sunday, Dec. 4:** Children in PreK-Gr5 will worship briefly with their families, then leave to attend Godly Play. They will be hearing the Story of Advent. Children return to the Sanctuary to sit with their families for Communion. It is very important that during this time, children remain seated with an adult so that they can model what is expected during this holy sacrament. The children's corner will be closed on Communion Sundays so that children are not tempted to spend the time playing. We will plan on providing a coloring sheet and crayons that they can use at their seats.

**Sunday, Dec. 11:** Children will worship briefly with their families and then head to their class to prepare for the Christmas Pageant.

**Sunday, Dec. 18: Christmas Pageant.** Children will remain in worship for the entire service. The Christmas Pageant will take the place of the sermon. All children are invited to participate.

### Heifer Marketplace

On Sunday, December 11 we will be holding the Heifer Marketplace after worship. Here you will be able to give a gift of hope in honor of your friends and family by purchasing a share or an animal. Honor cards will be provided. Your gift will be part of making a positive difference in the world. You will also have the opportunity to purchase handmade items to go along with your gift of hope.



## Winter Weather/Church Cancellation Policy

Winter weather is coming and every effort will be made to hold regular church services. However, if conditions present that are deemed to be unsafe, we will cancel church by 8:30 AM on Sunday morning. ### Advent Workshop/Wreath Making
