City Reach Overnight, February 10-11

Youth in grades 7- 12 will be heading into Boston to participate in City Reach, a program offered through Ecclesia Ministries. This is an opportunity for youth to learn about homelessness in Boston and to offer their assistance distributing food and clothing to those in need. We will meet with other Giv2 youth at Our Lady of the Assumption Church in Lynnfield for dinner together and to organize donations. We will be holding a collection from January 29-February 10 for the following items:

- All kinds of carrying cases such as backpacks, tote bags, fanny packs, small suitcases with wheels (used and in good condition)
- Travel-size toiletries such as soap, shampoo, deodorant, lotion, Chapstick, toothpaste, and shaving cream in small sizes, as well as tooth brushes and disposable razors, and tampons (no aftershave or mouthwash containing alcohol).
- *New white socks (there can never be too many of these)*
- New underwear (80% should be underwear for men)
- *Sleeping bags & blankets (clean and in good condition)*
- Gently used clothing- Think about what you would wear camping or hiking. Such comfortable, rugged clothing is just what is needed. There are about 4 times the number of male guests as female guests, so about 80% of our donations should be for men or unisex. Large sizes (XL, XXL, and XXXL) are very much in demand. Hooded sweatshirts and sweat pants are much appreciated.

A Note from Rev. Estelle

Dear friends,

It has been my great joy to be your Interim Pastor for the last year. My contract is up at the end of January and, though I will be with you for several weeks beyond that, I will not be renewing the contract. I have accepted a settled ministry position with First Trinitarian Congregational Church in Scituate.

We have accomplished so much as a congregation in this transitional time and I am very, very proud of all you've done. Your openness to reflection and your willingness to try new things show me that the Spirit is at work here at Centre Congregational Church!

I hope you feel as good about our time together as I do and I pray that you will stay open to see where God is leading. I am very grateful for the way you embraced me as your Interim Pastor and I want you to know that this leave-taking does not come without some heartache for me because I have come to care so deeply for you.

Over the last few months, many people have asked me, "Why can't you stay?" and the short reason is that the UCC governance structure doesn't allow that. The longer answer is that there are many reasons that Interim Pastors are automatically ineligible to apply for the Settled position. When there is an open Search and Call process for a settled pastorate, a congregation may receive 50+ ministerial profiles. The process for hiring an Interim Pastor is very different. The church works with the Associate Conference Minister to obtain the names and profiles of a select few candidates in search that the ACM thinks would be a good fit for the congregation. Thus, the pool of candidates is significantly smaller than for a settled position. The congregation has gotten to know the Interim so it could either give the Interim an unfair advantage over other candidates or, if members didn't appreciate something about the Interim, it could lead to resistance right from the beginning of the process. If the Interim were to be a candidate and then isn't chosen, it could lead to a "lame duck" time at the end of the Interim's pastorate with the church.

I hope you will be happy for me and I want you to know that I will continue to carry you in my heart.

A Note from Bruce Weaver

Dear friends,

We're grateful for the time Rev. Estelle has spent with us and we wish her well in her settled situation. I expect you have some questions about what her departure means for Centre Congregational Church. In terms of what's next, we'll be hiring a Bridge Pastor to assume the day to day pastoral responsibilities. Parish Council is working with the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ and expects to be conducting interviews soon. We don't anticipate any changes to the way the worship service is structured or to any other ways the church works. The Bridge Pastor will come in and maintain the status quo until a Settled Pastor is hired. The Search Team is working on the Church Profile and we plan to post the profile in the next month or so. Oftentimes, once a Church Profile is posted, the process of calling a Settled Pastor takes between three and six months.
