A View from the Bridge

As I write this, I am:

Of course, leaning on the Holy Spirit is not always a comforting stance. While I know that one traditional image of the Spirit is a descending white dove, I have come to envision the Spirit as more a combination of that dove (I could hunker down underneath those feathers and be nurtured, healed, comforted) crossed with a phoenix (think Fawkes, from the Harry Potter series — strong, healing powers, carry immense burdens, but you never know just when that bird will burst into flame, die, and then be reborn in the ashes). In other words, the Holy Spirit is wonderful (in the sense of evoking deep wonder), awesome (in the sense of evoking deep and worshipful awe); the Spirit is not only Guide and Helper, Teacher and Comforter, but also Challenger.

As the Search Committee examines clergy profiles, as potential candidates examine Centre Church's profile, the task for the rest of us is to pray for them. Pray for God's Holy Spirit to move among them, to inspire them, to give them wisdom and discernment, to hold them up and strengthen them in their work. And pray for the whole church, that God's

Holy Spirit will move us to offer not only comfort given to one another in community but also the fire of vision and action in ongoing service to God's world.

Dear friends,

I want to thank you very, very much for making my last Sunday with you so special. I thought I had planned all the surprises, but you managed to spring several on me. I am honored to have spent just over a year with you as your Interim Pastor and I feel blessed that part of my time is etched in stone on the walkway.

One of the things that delighted me over our time together was your willingness to try new things. That was evident in our last worship service when so many people participated in the prelude; several folks shared faith stories, the children came back for a mini message at the end of service; and you laughed in joy (rather than gasped in consternation) when I removed my stole and robe to demonstrate “that you don’t have to be a minister in a fancy robe to talk about God.”

The hand-made lilies and the card from the children will be treasured! I appreciate the Barnes and Noble gift card and will enjoy some sacred reading time. The cake was lovely—and delicious! And you still managed to have one more surprise in the beautiful altar flowers, which I’ve enjoyed all week.

Many people have asked if we can stay in touch and I regret to say that as an authorized clergy person in the United Church of Christ, ethical guidelines forbid an ongoing relationship. The expectation is that “For a minimum of one year up to three years, a minister will observe a no-contact boundary with congregants and will teach congregants to observe the same. This enables the past minister to fulfill the ministerial code of ethics, in support of the congregation’s relationship-building with a new minister.”

I do need you to know that I cannot engage in chats, comments, sharing, likes, or any pastoral care via social media. “Authorized ministers must refrain from providing pastoral care through digital communication after the date of their contract/call/covenant with their community of faith. Continuing to provide pastoral care through social media interferes with the ministry of one’s successor and is a violation of the Minister’s Code of Ethics.”

Three years isn’t so long. I hear you’ll be having a big 300th anniversary coming up in 2020. If you invite all the former pastors, I’ll see you then!

I am grateful for the time we’ve had together and I want you to know that you will always be in my heart.
