A View from the Bridge

Can you really travel abroad for a few weeks with just one carry-on bag? I remember reading about someone who is an expert on tips for packing who does just that. Well, I am a more efficient traveler than I used to be, but I've not fully embraced that particular goal.

It makes you ask the question: "What do you really need?"

Traveling light, living simply – a number of writers have enticed me for years with those values. If you think about it, Jesus himself surely followed those precepts, described as the "one with no place to lay his head." The idea is to unburden oneself of all that can keep you from attention to the precious people and most important things in life.

When Craig and I moved to our own home (after I had lived in a parsonage for nearly three decades!) it challenged me to examine what I "carry around" in my life: books, papers, clothing, artwork, mugs/dishes/utensils/cleaning supplies/organizers and bins/guides on how to clear clutter(!), photos, memorabilia, gifts I was never brave enough to pass on to someone who might really appreciate them... Being able to move in a piecemeal fashion afforded me both the opportunity to divest myself of things no longer needed, things that haven't been unearthed in many years, and the opportunity just to box it all up and not have to deal with it "until after the move is complete." I did a little of both

– but I have to confess that I caved in to more of the latter.

Retirement (which has come in stages!) challenged me further to pursue this downsizing/divesting process. In the past few years I have become better at it. But there is still a lot of "stuff," "baggage."

One can consider "baggage" to be an economic equity issue, a sociological issue, even an environmental issue. But I wonder how many people ever think of it as a spiritual issue. For me my baggage is a sign that I have difficulty fully trusting God for my well-being on the journey through life, and find it difficult fully to recognize and accept God's grace that says I am enough in God's sight without all the trappings, that I am a valued and valuable human being without all the "stuff" that claims to proclaim how useful, how knowledgeable, how productive I am.

The Holy Spirit continues to invite me to face this spiritual issue. I hope that I will find myself coming closer than ever to God as I divest myself of "stuff." If I am not holding on to so much, I'll have a hand free to place into the hand of the One who would love to remind me that I am loved, just as I am.
