December 15, 2017

Beloved of Centre Church,

I have been searching for what I would say to you in this first Christmas greeting as your pastor. In the midst of this season of expectant hope, deep peace, and exuberant joy, I have been walking with some of our own through the grittiest of life's experiences. I have been witnessing you being Christ for one another. Sickness and suffering, healing and death nearly always raise to our lips the deepest of life's questions. Questions of why, why not, and how come? Questions about God and God's deepest longings for God's own creation. Questions that are largely unanswerable with words. Questions that can only be heard and held so that, at least for a moment, in the presence of another, maybe they don't feel so heavy.

Then, this morning, the Annunciation and the Incarnation wove themselves together in my mind in a way they never had before. The preposterousness of an Angel appearing to a girl and telling her this amazing, terrifying thing was going to happen to her. And the equally amazing and perplexing knowledge that God was born in human flesh and experienced all the breathtaking joy and sorrow that earthly life holds for us all. That for Mary, the incarnation was not an "O, Holy Night" experience, but began nine long and short months before. Nine months of carrying Emmanuel within her.

In his book *The Manger is Empty: Stories in Time*, Lutheran Pastor Walter Wangerin, Jr. relates the story of how his daughter Mary came to know something of this great mystery. Through the love of a dying old woman, her funeral and burial on Christmas eve, and playing the role of Mary in the Christmas pageant, seven-year-old Mary declared, "Jesus doesn't have to be in the manger, does he? He goes back and forth, doesn't he? I mean, he came from heaven, and he was borned right here, but then he went back to heaven again, and because he came and went he's coming and going *all* the time, right?"

"We are all called to be mothers of God – for God is always waiting to be born." – Meister Eckart, 13th Century Christian Mystic

I hope that like Mary, the mother of Jesus, and wise Mary Wangerin, you will be open to Divine revelation, to what God is hoping to birth into the world through you. That in awe, you might accept that it is indeed true that Jesus is coming and going all the time, and also abiding in each one of us, accompanying us toward our potential in this world, toward seeing and knowing and being Divine love in this life. I hope that you might feel Jesus abiding within you and that like Mary, you might hold yourself in the perplexity of such a thing. That you might ponder it in your heart. And rather than clinging to the limits of human reason, you and I will step into the mystery, open ourselves to it, give ourselves over to it. For nothing is impossible with God!

Come, Lord Jesus, abide in and with us!
