Living the Paschal Mystery

It wasn't until adulthood that I immersed myself fully into observing Holy Week. Despite my Roman Catholic upbringing, and many journeys through the Stations of the Cross and participation in the Passion narrative, I hadn't ever allowed myself to go all the way to the cross with Jesus. But in adulthood, worshiping in our churches in Ohio, Virginia, New Hampshire, and Massachusetts, I had new encounters with Jesus' via dolorosa - his "way of sorrow." In Maundy Thursday and Good Friday worship I experienced, through the Word, spoken and sung, through table fellowship that reminded us deeply that it was Jesus' last supper with his friends, through light extinguished to complete darkness and silence, I opened my heart to Jesus' passion and the well of my own grief and sorrow, year after year. And again and again, the shock and surprise of Jesus' resurrection on Easter morning washed over me anew, and I experienced the mystery of new life in Christ with joy and a lingering question: What now?

Then, during my time as a student minister at Hancock Church, a confluence of events led me to explore the Christian spiritual practice of lament and to teach it through a variety of experiences to the Hancock congregation. In my exploration and preparation, I was introduced to *The Holy Longing: The Search for a Christian Spirituality*, by Ronald Rolheiser. In it, I found a truth that resonated deeply for me. Rolheiser describes a spirituality of the paschal mystery and how it can serve as a framework for us to move through the

process of transformation, of dying and letting go so that we may receive new life and new spirit. He further explains that the paschal cycle is composed of five clear moments, each one part of a whole process, each important in relation to the others for the cycle of transformation to be complete. The first moment is Good Friday, "the loss of life - real death." "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies it yields a rich harvest." (John 12:24) To apply the paschal mystery as a paradigm for transformation in our own lives begins with acknowledging the deaths that we experience during our lives. We experience the death of our youth, the death of our wholeness, the death of our dreams, and so many more.

This year, I invite you to journey through the paschal mystery, from death to resurrection, to 40 days of readjustment, to Ascension, to Pentecost. We'll begin at our Maundy Thursday service, acknowledging the deeply personal deaths we are experiencing as we journey to the cross with Jesus. Then we'll claim our rebirth in the bright light of Easter morning. And as we move into the season of Easter, we'll explore in more detail how we move through this process toward accepting the spirit of new life at Pentecost.
