An Act of God

Three nights ago, the beauty of the Wakefield skyline was forever altered by the lightning strike that hit the spire of the First Baptist Church. The fire that lightning strike sparked required the firefighters of seven towns to keep it contained and protect the surrounding buildings. Hundreds gathered to witness, pray, lament, and share stories as she was consumed by the flames. Many have likened the experience of losing their beloved church building to a death, and one person even reflected to me that bearing witness to her demise was akin to sitting at the bedside of a dying loved one. There is an indescribable mix of awe, sorrow, and privilege to accompany someone in their dying. I am certain that many who witnessed this fire felt the full breadth of human emotion in that experience. We use the phrase "an act of God" to describe these events caused by environmental forces beyond our control. And yet, in this case, it raises questions for the faithful. We wonder aloud, how God could let this happen to God's house, even as we can use our reason to answer ourselves. We can say that a church is not its building, but rather anywhere two or more gather in Christ's name. And yet, that thought alone does not help the grieving, because no matter that truth, our buildings are containers that hold so much of our lives. Being inside a beloved space evokes memories of all the important moments of life that happened there and the loved ones they were shared with.

So last night we gathered to pray and sing our lament and our hope with God's beloved people

of First Baptist Church. Those gathered shared memories of what was, both the long history of the congregation including two other fires that destroyed their buildings, and the recent stories of the impact of that building on individual lives. We sang a hymn that was written for the laying of the corner stone of that building called "Bring Forth the Corner Stone," by Miss Georgie L. Heath. One of the verses says,

Tis built of living stones
And through eternal days
Shall court and transept, arch and aisle
Be vocal with His praise.

This reminds me of the story of the rebuilding of the Temple in Jerusalem as told in Ezra 3:11-13. "And all the people responded with a great shout when they praised the Lord, because the foundation of the house of the Lord was laid. But many of the priests and Levites and heads of families, old people who had seen the first house on its foundations, wept with a loud voice when they saw this house, though many shouted aloud for joy, so that the people could not distinguish the sound of the joyful shout from the sound of the people's weeping, for the people shouted so loudly that the sound was heard far away."

May we be there with our siblings in Christ as they determine their way forward. May we surround them with love and resources and the safe space they need to express ALL that they feel, their sorrow, their hope, and their joy. We can be an act of God's love for them and for each other in this time.
