When Your Tank is Empty

Sometimes, you just have nothing left. No matter how you pull, push, hope, or grasp, you have absolutely nothing left in yourself to pour out for others, or even for yourself. Some call this "compassion fatigue," but I'm talking about something perhaps even deeper than that. That moment when you literally can't form words into sentences that make sense or complete meaningful actions. You are completely soul weary and exhausted. You are so empty you are at risk of running out of "fuel" and being stranded by the side of the road that is your life. Has this ever happened to you?

When we are at the end of the resources that are ours for living - water, bread, hope, faith, sleep, words, empathy, compassion, LOVE - we owe it to ourselves and to all of the people in our lives to stop and fill up. And to let go of any guilt we have about doing so. If you have bought into the idea that there are always a few more drops in the tank, you owe it to yourself to remember the metaphor of the car running out of gas on a dark and stormy night. You really do have an "empty." Even Jesus had an "empty." The Gospels remind us that He regularly separated himself from his active engagement with the world in order to pray.

"And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray." - Matthew 14:23a

What is your metaphorical mountain? Where do you need to go and what do you need to do in order to fill your tank? Where is the "quiet alone" that you need in order to refill your heart and soul with God's love? How do you heed the instruction to "put on your own oxygen mask before assisting others?" Do you take

the time to sit and eat your meals? Do you get enough sleep? Maybe your prayer time is during your morning run or walk. Maybe it is kayaking. Or maybe it is on your morning commute, practicing gratitude rather than road rage. The ways we "fill up" are as individual as we are. But what is universal is the need to do so.

You are human. I am human. Jesus was fully human. We cannot run on empty. Not physically. Not mentally. Not spiritually. The Spirit of the Living God is just waiting to rush into the empty inside of you, if you'll just stop long enough to let it be.
